The Bulldogs took 16 athletes in 13 events to the NCS Tri-Valley Championships, which already an impressive array of competitors. These youngsters had to face perhaps the stiffest competition of all the four Area Championships in NCS, and the Bulldogs comported themselves well.


Even though the level of competition was high, and some of the emotional intensity of the DAL Championships had ebbed, the Alhambra effort was strong all around.

We advance 3 athletes in 4 events on to the next level meet, which is the overall NCS Championships. This NCS Meet of Champions is the gateway meet to the California State Championships, which is the best high school meet in the country. To make it to this meet, one step away from the Sate Meet, is a pinnacle accomplishment in itself.

Our top sprinters Mister and Desie put on quite a show. Mister now shows absolutely no effects from his catastrophic broken leg injury from last October and sped to his best-ever electronic wind-legal time. Desie dropped her school record once again.

### Notes:

1. **Team balance:** We were able to take athletes to this championship level in almost all the major event categories - - sprints, relays, hurdles, jumps, and throws. Still missing from our team repertoire is representation in the long sprints, middle distance, and the vault. Nonetheless, this shows that as a team we are well-balanced, and more so than many other schools.

2. And we are making strides in continuing to build up a foundation in those other events, with improvements in the lower ranks in the vault and the distance.

3. Young Team - - we may be graduating 13 seniors this year, but we have an outstanding crop of youngsters still with us. While the future is never certain, this is strong foundation to continue to build upon.

4. **Student Volunteers** - - Coach Brewer is the high jump official at this upcoming meet of champions, and he can always use student volunteers to help make running this event efficiently. This would be for both Friday 5/17 and Saturday 5/18, 9:00 a.m.. until 1:00 p.m.

This is acceptable for volunteer hours. Student volunteers also get event t-shirts and lunch.

The meet will be held at Diablo Valley College this year, so the venue is conveniently close by.
