#### Commentary:

Even with all the shuffling around, and the heat, and the uncertainty about our opponents, our boys' teams did well, especially against our division opponents. Frosh-Soph Boys - -

it turned out that it was Ygnacio Valley that held all the cards today, and not Benicia. The YV boys not only dominated our division, they beat half the teams from the upper division as well. But it turns out this is their entire team, as they didn't enter anyone in the Var and JV races. It remains to be seen if they will keep these boys on the FS level the rest of the season.

We were able to take care of the rest of the division, and this is without our top Frosh boys. Not bad at all, and as we continue to improve over the season, we can do even better.

#### JV Boys - -

This one was close. In the direct scoring between Alhambra and Benicia, we lost by a single point . .. which means that somewhere in the race if any one of our top 5 runners had passed a Benicia boy, we'd be in first place now. But we have two more races against them to change things.

#### Varsity Boys - -

We know that we can rely on Carson to lead the way for us at the front of races. Graham is a reliable performer. And the freshmen are still learning about this whole varsity thing . . . the race starts out fast, and no one slows down. For a full three miles.

Against Benicia, we lost by 7 points. Looking at the results, we see that there is a full two minute gap between Carson and the rest of our pack. We need to cut that gap down considerably, and next time we meet Benicia the story could very well be different. Girls - -

With a small girls squad, we have to focus on the individual goals. Pearla is just a freshman, and Clara is in her first year of full health while running, so their improvement curve is ahead of them. Nicole is a proven quantity, and she has made great strides since last year and is a real threat at the top end of races.
