Additionally, we were but 39 points behind Acalanes, who is ranked right ahead of us in the NCS preview.

For the race itself, Tyler and Ben were the quickest Bulldogs off the line. A bit back were Ryan, Carson, and Nolin. Colby was in lurk mode further back, and Sam was having a rough day.

Up the final hill, Ben and Tyler had been joined by Colby and Ryan, and the final sprint sorted out our close-knit top 4. Nolin gutted out a solid #5 spot for us. Carson was in cruise mode under coaches' direction. Sam struggled in.

Even with all the minor in-race variations, the outcome was still strong. We have two weeks to finesse this team into even more of a contending squad.

4. NCS Races

We will contiinue training with our North Coast Section squads, boys and girls, for the next two weeks. Workouts will be at the standard time and place. The training will continue as before.

5. NCS Tee shirt sales - -

Now that we have had our taste of customers clamoring for shirts, we get to move on to the NCS sales table. Instead of dealing with 576 athletes and assorted coaches and parents who evidently all wanted shirts yesterday, we get to deal with about 1300 athletes who will all want shirts and caps and patches at the NCS races. 6. Post-Season Training

And for those athletes who want an even better season for 2020 cross country, that preparation starts right away.

7. Awards Night - - our team awards night will be Wednesday, December 4. Put that on your calendar, and stay tuned for the details.

8. Next Season Already - - even though we have not yet put the 2019 season to bed entirely, the 2020 season is already in its formative stages. In broad strokes, here is a general prognosis for next year's cross country team:

Strengths - -

- momentum from this year's string of successes
- almost all of our impact runners from this year will be returning
- the team atmosphere of support, athletes and families alike, is exceptional

Needs - -

- more athletes, especially girls. Recruiting is in order.
- continuing to work on focus and screening out distractions
- expectations - continue to raise the bar for individual and team outcomes
