D-IV NCS Boys' Varsity Rankings

Rankings are just that - - speculations, guesses, paper comparisons, personal opinion. Still, in the absence of head-to-head races, it is still interesting to see what those guesses might be.

Last season our boys' varsity team was 4th at the NCS D-IV championship. That was a good finish, even though we had hoped for a bit more. What does the crystal ball say about this season?

- 1. <u>Piedmont</u> - the Highlanders are blessed with a good #1 runner and then a pack of 5 more boys within 10 seconds of each other.
