Notes:

- 1. **Looking good:** Yes, the coaches were expecting the team to run a bit better as a team. The workouts have been happening, daily attendance is pretty good, and team cohesion is strong. But we did not expect this strong of a surge in Bulldog effort. This was a very good eye-opener for many of our runners as they found out just how competitive they can be.
- 2. **Lots of medals.** This is good. And lots of top 10 finishes. Also very good.
- 3. It took a bit of wiggling and plotting, especially with a small roster, to get at least one Alhambra runner in each race. And with the

- absentees, we were only able to field three complete teams for the boys. The take-away from this is that regardless, we are becoming competitive at all levels of our squad - varsity, JV, Frosh-Soph.
- 4. **Above the fold -** as always, the mark of success in a season or a meet or a race is if we can point to being "above the fold." This means being in the upper half of the results. And again, we come out well by this regard. 13 of our 22 runners, and 2 of our 3 complete teams, were able to achieve this mark.
- 5. **Great parent presence again**. Snack table looking good. Outstanding team support for each other. Whatta team!
- 6. About the All-Time top 10 lists: Alhambra has been attending the meet for only 7 years, and with a small program, it takes a while to fill up the All-Time lists. Today was a good day there as well. 15 current Bulldogs are now on those lists.

Also, construction on the Westmoor HS campus has forced several alterations to the course over the last few years. The course has remained almost the same distance, and the same geographical features have been incorporated, but the time times are not entirely comparable. Still, for the basis of history, we will continue to assemble these lists, along with the asterisk of explanation.

And just how do we all stack up this week?

Here is the time comparison for the team for this week. Invitationals like this, with all races at the same distance, allow us to see how the total team is developing. While moving up on the list is always a good thing, what is more important is to see just how we are closing the gaps between our runners as we are trying to improve "the pack" that makes good teams better teams.
